The Easter tankard is always sailed for on Easter Sunday. Be there and try to win what could be the oldest sporting trophy in North Wales. It was presented by the 'Ladies of Llandudno' as a prize in the Llandudno Town Regatta on the first Monday in August 1868. It is the only trophy where there is a complete list of all winners engraved on the plinth starting with the winner in 1962
