Club Development

After considerable discussion at both the Development Committee and the Management Committee it was decided **NOT** to proceed with the proposed flats development on the following grounds:

1. The reduction in dinghy parking space was not acceptable
 2. Disruption during the period of construction, over possibly two sailing seasons, to all club activities.
 3. The difficulty of finding and operating a temporary base during the construction period.
 4. Anticipated problems in the relationship with residents, particularly in the busy period when events and functions are held at the club.
 5. The unease that many members had with regard to loss of control of the site.
 6. The strong objections that were put forward by the planners in reply to the initial request for a meeting.
- The Company have been informed of this decision.

Dinghy Park

On Saturday February 2nd all dinghy berths will be re-allocated.

At the same time, stickers will be issued to those who have paid their dinghy berthing fee of £35.00.

These stickers should be placed on the transom of your boat.

If you wish to retain your present berth, it is essential that you are present at the club on the 2nd Feb.

Anyone not present may have their dinghy berth re-allocated.
